	<p><b>Institute of Archaeology</b></p> <p>Mount Zion has played a primary role in Jerusalem’s story for thousands of years, yet it was the 19 years of Jerusalem’s division that created its significance in the modern State of Israel. As the closest site to the Temple Mount under Israeli control, Mount Zion has become a site of pilgrimage. Schoolchildren and dignitaries alike come to Mount Zion; in fact, Israel’s President, Yitzhak Ben Zvi, opened an office at this location, on the roof of King David’s Tomb.</p> <p>The tradition identifies this site as the actual burial site of King David, but who really is buried inside the sarcophagus and what did a dubious Italian engineer from the 19th century reveal? All this and more will be explored in a tour to Mt. Zion, both from a historical and contemporary perspective together with Hebrew University Alumni Amit Reem from the Israel Antiquities Authority. <b>OPTION 2: Rehavia – Tour given by Ezra Korman, Hebrew University Alumni and Chancellor of the University Prof. Menahem Ben Sasson</b></p> <p>The neighborhood of Rehavia was built in the 1930’s and was home to many Hebrew University professors and departments. It was also the site of the National Institutions and the site of great celebration with the announcement of the United Nations Partition Plan. This tour will meander through the streets of Rehavia, visiting sites where some of the most momentous events connected to the first years of Israel’s independence took place as well as locations that served the Hebrew University after 1948 – including Terra Sancta, the Rattisbonne Monastery, Yitzhak Ben Tzvi’s home, now the Ben Tzvi Institute, and more.</p>
