



ALBERTA SCHOLARSHIPS

High School Students

1. Alexander Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship

Purpose:

To recognize and reward academic achievement at the senior high school level and to encourage students to pursue post-secondary studies.

Value: Up to \$2,500

Eligibility:

Applicants must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident and an Alberta resident; and plan to enroll or be enrolled full-time in a post-secondary program or apprenticeship program.

Selection:

A student must have a minimum combined average based on five designated courses in at least one grade: Grade 10, 11 or 12. The minimum average, value of the award, and courses that can be used depend on the year the student graduated.

2. Dr. Ernest and Minnie Mehl Scholarships

Purpose:

To encourage students to pursue a post-secondary education and to recognize and reward exceptional academic achievement at the senior high school level.

Value: One award of \$3,500

Eligibility:

Open residents of Alberta who are Canadian citizens or permanent residents.

Must have completed their final year of high school in Alberta at a school that follows the Alberta Education Curriculum.

Applicants must be continuing their studies at a degree granting post-secondary institution in Canada. University transfer programs are acceptable.

Selection:

Applicants are ranked according to the average obtained on Diploma Examinations in one of: English 30-1, 30-2, or Français 30, 30-2, and Social Studies 30, 30-1 or 30-2 plus any three other subjects: Pure Mathematics 30, Applied Mathematics 30, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, Physics 30 or Science 30. Only the first writing will be considered. Financial need will also be considered. Recipient cannot be in receipt of any other scholarship with a value in excess of the cost of tuition.

Undergraduate Students

3. Louise McKinney Post-Secondary Scholarships

Purpose:

To recognize exceptional academic achievement and encourage outstanding students to continue their studies at the post-secondary level.

Value: \$2,500

Eligibility:

Applicants must be residents of Alberta and plan to enroll at a university, college or technical institute, in the second or subsequent year of full-time study. Alberta students studying outside the province because their program of study is not offered in Alberta will be considered for a scholarship if their class standing is in the top two percent of their program.

Selection:

Students studying in-province are nominated by the Student Awards Office at participating Alberta post-secondary institutions. It is recommended that students contact the Awards Office to determine their eligibility, i.e. the GPA and the number of credits required - normally, courses taken for credit or taken at an institution other than the nominating institution are not considered.

4. University of Calgary

Exchange/Transfer Students

Eligibility: Undergraduate Award:

Exchange students who participate in an exchange that involves only one term of study are eligible to apply for Undergraduate Awards. Only courses that transfer to the U of C will be included in scholarship averages.

Note: Students taking an exchange program of eight months (two semesters of study) are **not** eligible to apply for Undergraduate Awards; they are eligible to apply for Transfer Awards upon their return to U of C.

Transfer Awards:

Continuing U of C students in exchange programs who are returning to the University of Calgary must have the equivalent of at least four full-course equivalents (24 units) in transfer credit completed at their host institution. Transfer courses extra to degree will not be included. Students must be pursuing a first degree.

Note: Students entering or continuing in the Bachelor of Education (Master of Teaching Program) are **not** eligible for transfer Awards.

Possible Award: Varies

Application Process:

The Competitive Undergraduate Awards Online Application is available in the Student Center through the myUofC portal. Nominated Undergraduate Awards do not require an application as nomination is made automatically by the faculty.

Graduate Students

5. Sir James Lougheed Awards of Distinction

Purpose:

To recognize academic achievement and provide Albertans with the opportunity for advanced study at institutions outside of Alberta. Students studying in Alberta should apply for the Ralph Steinhauer Awards for Distinction.

Value:

Masters Level - up to \$15,000

Doctoral Level - up to \$20,000

Eligibility:

Applicants must be Canadian Citizens or Landed Immigrants, be Alberta residents, and be enrolled or planning to enroll full-time in a graduate program at an institution outside of Alberta. There is a lifetime maximum of two awards per student. At the doctoral level, students must have completed at least one full year of graduate study or a master's degree.

Selection:

Recipients are chosen by a selection committee appointed by the Presidents of the universities in Alberta. Applicants are judged on previous academic accomplishments, program of study, appraiser's evaluations, answers to the essay question, and general impressions from the application form.

Eligibility:

Open to Canadian citizens or landed immigrants.

Based on financial need.

Students from other provinces will be considered if there is no suitable applicant from Alberta.

Possible Award: Varies

Application Process:
