



BRITISH COLUMBIA SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

1. The Mona Leith Scholarship Endowment for Students from British Columbia or Western Canada

Eligibility:

Open to students from British Columbia for full year studies at The Hebrew University. Only if no suitable applicant from British Columbia is available will students from other provinces be considered.

Possible Award: Varies

Application Process: Interested students should submit a separate written request for consideration attached to their Asper National Scholarship application submitted to the Canadian Friends of the Hebrew University.

2. Jewish Federation of Greater Vancouver

Eligibility:

Eligibility is limited to Jewish applicants, ages 14-26

Eligibility is limited to applicants who demonstrate financial need

Eligibility is limited to residents of BC, including BC residents who may be temporarily studying outside of BC

Priority will be given to applicants making their first trip to Israel

Possible Award: Varies with financial needs: The current maximum grant available is \$2,500 per applicant

Applicants are eligible to receive one grant per 24 month period, and priority will be given to applicants who have not yet received a grant from the Federation.

3. Go Global Award

Value: Up to \$1,000 per term

Eligibility: All students nominated for exchange, study or research abroad will be automatically considered. A separate application is not required. You will be notified of your award after nomination to the program. To be eligible for the award, you must have an average of at least **70%** on your best **24** credits in the Winter Session before your exchange (with no failed or incomplete courses). If you were on a co-op work term, you must have at least 70% on your best 12 credits in the other term.

Graduate students in good standing with their program are also eligible for the Go Global Award.

4. Go Global Scholarship

Value: Up to \$1500 per term

Eligibility: All undergraduate students nominated for exchange, study or research abroad will be automatically considered. A separate application is not required. The scholarship will be given on a competitive basis to those with the highest average and a minimum of 27 credits.

5. Choquette Family Foundation Student Mobility Award

Value: \$10,000 (10 awards available)

Eligibility: The Choquette Family Foundation offers awards totaling \$100,000 for undergraduate and graduate UBC students participating in a Go Global program. The intention of these awards is to support academically strong students who are interested in



participating in an international experience but could not do so without financial assistance.

Minimum requirements are that you must have an average of at least **70%** on your best **24** credits in the Winter Session before your exchange (with no failed or incomplete courses). If you were on a co-op work term, you must have at least 70% on your best 12 credits in the other term.

Students must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent residents. The international program must be at least eight months in duration and take place outside of Canada (excluding Quebec) or the United States.

Students must complete an application package containing:

- A completed [application form \(298 KB PDF\)](#)
- A personal reference
- A statement of purpose

Completed applications must be submitted to Student Financial Assistance & Awards in Brock Hall no later than **May 17, 2010**, at 4:00 pm.

6. Charlotte Froese FISCHER Student Mobility Award in Science

Value: To be determined (alternates each year between outgoing UBC students – odd years, and incoming partner university students – even years)

Eligibility: The Charlotte Froese FISCHER Student Mobility Award in Science is available to undergraduate UBC Vancouver students in the Faculty of Science participating in recognized student exchange programs through Go Global. Exchanges must be at least eight months in duration and take place outside of Canada.

To be considered:

- You must be enrolled in the Faculty of Science at UBC or a partner university.
- You must be an undergraduate student enrolled at the UBC Vancouver campus or a partner university campus.

To apply, you must submit the following with your Go Global application by the deadline:

- The Charlotte Froese FISCHER application form (download below)
- A current resumé outlining any related extracurricular activities and in support of your academic interests and study abroad experience



- A current print-out of your academic record from the Student Service Centre showing all grades completed to date

This award is adjudicated by representatives from the Faculty of Science and Go Global.

7. Premier's One World Scholarship

An application package can be obtained online at the [British Columbia Scholarship Society](#). Completed applications must be submitted to the Student Financial Assistance & Awards Office in Brock Hall by 4:00 pm on the closing date.

Value: \$20,000 (only one award available across British Columbia)

Eligibility: The Irving K Barber British Columbia Scholarship Society is offering one scholarship valued at \$20,000 to a BC Public Post Secondary undergraduate student on the basis of academic merit.

To be considered:

1. You must have a minimum of 75% on 27 credits in the Winter Session before your exchange with no failed or standing deferred courses, or 13.5 credits if you were participating in co-op for one of the terms.
2. You must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident and have been a BC resident for at least the past 12 months.
3. You must plan to carry out your Go Global exchange outside of Canada and the US, and not in a country from which you emigrated in the past ten years.
4. You must have been accepted into a Go Global program for a full year.
5. You must submit two reference letters, one of which must be from a UBC faculty member.

Application deadline: May 17, 2010

8. Arts Travel and Learn Abroad Award for Students (ATLAAS)

Value: up to \$2,500

Eligibility: ATLAAS awards are available to undergraduate students who have completed at least one year (27 credits) in the Faculty of Arts, and who have been accepted into a UBC-approved international learning program.



- The awards are made on the recommendation of a selection committee within the Faculty of Arts.
- In selecting recipients, consideration is given to strong academic performance and demonstrated interest in the area of study outlined in your statement of purpose.

9. Graduate Student International Research Mobility Award

In partnership with the Faculty of Graduate Studies and UBC's Go Global program, the Office of the Vice-President, Research invites applications from UBC graduate students who wish to participate in a research abroad opportunity at a leading institution outside North America, and from UBC faculty who desire to host an overseas graduate research student at UBC. Students must be enrolled as a full-time graduate student at UBC or at a university outside of North America at the time of application. Priority is given to PhD students.

- Apply online by completing all the necessary forms.
- Deadline: 6 Weeks before end of study period
 - (Hebrew U is a designated school)

Full-time students - Instructions

Below are the basic steps in applying for B.C. and Canada student loans if you are a [full-time](#) student.

1. [Choose the post-secondary school](#) you want to attend, and determine the [study period](#) (registration period) for which you need funding.
2. Figure out how much money you need to attend school:
 - Use the [financial need formula](#).
 - Complete the [budget worksheet](#)  [154kb].
 - Check your eligibility for the [maximum funding limits](#).

3. Complete the correct StudentAid BC application forms. There are several ways you can do this:
 - [Apply Online](#)
 - [Request paper/hardcopy applications](#) – the forms will be mailed to you.
 - You will need to refer to the [school program codes for 2010/2011](#) (for studies between Aug. 1, 2010 and July 31, 2011) when completing the paper application form.
 - [Contact us](#) by mail, fax or phone to request forms.
 - Visit the financial aid office at the school you will be attending.
4. After you have sent in your forms, you can [check your application status online](#). StudentAid BC will process your application within six weeks and notify you of the outcome.

Application deadlines

The latest you can apply for full-time student loans is six weeks before your study program ends as long you have provided all the required documentation.

The earliest you can apply for full-time student loans is when applications for the upcoming [program year](#) are made available to the public.

You do not have to be accepted into your study program before applying for student assistance, but you will not receive any money until your school confirms you are enrolled in full-time study and your study period has begun.
