### 1. Canadian Friends of Hebrew University

#### **Israel Asper National Scholarship Fund**

**Eligibility:**

Open to Canadian citizens and landed immigrants of Canada.

**Based on financial need.**

**Requirements:** All applicants must provide full family tax returns for the taxation year prior to application year.

**Possible Award:** range from \$1,000.00 - \$10,000.00

**Application Process:** Scholarship application form is included with application package, or can be downloaded from the [website](http://www.cfhu.org/students-scholarships). (<http://www.cfhu.org/students-scholarships>)

**Possible Award:** Varies

**Application Process:** Interested students should submit a separate written request for consideration attached to their Asper National Scholarship application submitted to the Canadian Friends of the Hebrew University

## **2. The UJA Federation**

### **The Morris M. Pulver Scholarship Fund**

**Eligibility:**

Open to undergraduate, graduate and post-graduate students who are Canadian citizens (residing in Canada).

For students in need of financial aid

For students planning to study for a full academic year

Must have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or its equivalent

For students who are eligible for full-time attendance at an associated recognized institutions of higher learning in Israel

**Requirements:** Two letters of reference from persons other than relatives  
Income Tax Return and Tax Assessment

**Possible Award:** Needs based

## **3. Canadian Zionist Federation - Dr. Leon Aryeh Kronitz Scholarship**



**Eligibility:**

Must be recent high school graduates, university students or graduate students pursuing Teacher Training or General studies in Israel

Must be Canadian Citizens who can demonstrate **financial need**

Must be accepted for at least one year at an accredited postsecondary program

**Possible Award:** Varies

**Application Process:**

Need recommendations from three individuals, one of which must be your high school principal or director of studies at your university.

## 4. Synagogue Funds

**Eligibility:**

Many synagogues have funds for higher Jewish education offered to members of the congregation

**Contact:** Inquire within your individual synagogue about the possibility of a scholarship.

Synagogues are usually receptive to these inquiries. You should also try contacting the Brotherhood and Sisterhoods of your synagogue or any other organization that might have spare funds.

## 5. Hebrew University of Jerusalem

### Lady Davis Fellowship Trust Fund

**Eligibility:**

Visiting Professorships - you must be a full or an associate professor.

Post-doctoral researchers - if you are applying for the Academic Year 2010-2011 you must have received your Doctorate not earlier than the first of October, 2006.

Doctoral students - you must be enrolled in a recognized doctoral program at a university outside Israel.

**Application Process:**

Lady Davis Fellowships are awarded after a rigorous academic review process. Candidates are ranked first at the Departmental level, and then at Faculty level. Prospective candidates must establish contact with the relevant Faculty or Department at the Hebrew University, and ensure that there is a Faculty member willing to sponsor the application. We will not be able to process an application without a sponsor. **Requirements:**

Visiting Professors are typically expected to teach courses, participate in or lead seminars, engage in research with their hosts, or interact with other Faculty members. The precise mix of activities will be mutually decided upon by the Visitor and his/her academic sponsor.

**Notes:** As a result of financial uncertainty the fellowship temporarily suspended the Doctoral Fellowship Program for the academic year 2010-11. They are still accepting applicants in other areas.

**Eligibility:** Available to qualified citizens of Canada, the United Kingdom, or the United States who are pursuing Doctoral studies in business, economics or a related field at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. This endowment fund is designed to attract doctoral students of outstanding academic achievement from the above countries to the Hebrew University to pursue doctoral studies in the above fields.

### **Rothberg International School Graduate Merit Scholarship**

**Eligibility:**

To be considered, candidates must have completed their Undergraduate degree and have a minimum GPA of 3.8 or equivalent. Any candidate for an M.A. Program may apply and those selected will be eligible for a two-year fellowship, conditional on maintenance of academic performance. Candidates for any other graduate program are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Merit Fellowship.

Needs Based awards also available

**Possible Award:** The RIS administration has decided that, beginning in 2009/10, RIS Merit Scholarships will be awarded for a sum equivalent to the cost of full tuition for the academic year or one semester.

## **6. The Dennis Waldman Foundation for Jewish Education**

**Eligibility:** The Dennis Waldman Scholarship is open to students in their graduating year from either a Jewish or public secondary school who intends to pursue university-level study. In either case, the applicant must provide a demonstrated history of involvement in Jewish communal life.

**Requirements:** academic achievement, teacher references, extra-curricular activities, service to the community, and an essay.

**Possible Award:** varies

**Application Process:** Application is available beginning in January. Applicant must submit [Application](#) by mail or in person. Application available on website.

## 7. Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture

### **International Doctoral Scholarship for Studies Specializing in Jewish Fields**

**Eligibility:** Any graduate student specializing in a Jewish field that is officially enrolled or registered in a doctoral program at a recognized university is eligible to apply. Only applicants who have had their dissertation approved can apply.

**Possible Award:** The amount of the scholarship varies in accordance with the cost of living in the country where the student is studying. Grants range up to \$10,000 a year. *Grants are given for one academic year.* They can be renewed, upon submission of a new application and supporting documents, up to a maximum of four years.

**Application Process:** Applications can be obtained on individual written request from the Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture, 50 Broadway, 34<sup>th</sup> Floor, New York, NY 10004, U.S.A.

**Deadline:** All applications, including renewals, must be submitted before October 31st.

### **International Fellowship in Jewish Studies and Jewish Culture**

**Eligibility:** Any qualified scholar, researcher or artist who possesses the knowledge and experience to formulate and implement a project in a field of Jewish specialization can apply for support.

**Possible Award:** The amount of the grant varies in accordance with the cost of living in the country in which the fellowship recipient resides. Grants range up to \$10,000 per year. *Grants are for one academic year.* Applicants who wish to renew their grant for a second year must request renewal in writing and submit a new application by October 31st of the year in which their current grant is in effect. Ordinarily, no more than two grants will be made to an individual.

**Application Process:** Applications can be obtained on individual written request with a brief description of the project from the Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture, 50 Broadway – 34th Floor, New York, New York 10004, U.S.A.

## 8. Canadian Government Student Loans

**Eligibility:** Planning to attend a post-secondary institution. Must be able to show financial need.

**NOTE:** it is very important to apply for Student loans as your eligibility for these loans may make you eligible for many other awards.

**Possible Award:** Based on financial need.

**REMINDER:** these are loans that must be repaid

**Application Process:** Apply to your province:

## 9. MASA Scholarships

**Eligibility:**

Applicants must be Jewish

Applicants cannot be a new immigrant or Citizen of Israel

Applicants must never have been on a long-term program in Israel that began after 1<sup>st</sup> September 2004.

Applicants must have graduated high school and are under the age of 31 at the start of the program.

There are also many needs based scholarships available

**Possible Award:** \$1000 for undergrad/GAP year

\$3000 for 5 month post-grad

\$4500 for full year/8 month post-grad

Further awards are available based on financial need

**Eligibility:**

You must get accepted to one of the [affiliated learning programs](#).  
Once you've been accepted to one of learning programs, you must commit yourself to 3-4 consecutive weeks of learning and boarding at the program.

**Possible Award:** \$500 grant

**Application Process:** Fill out the [Application form](#)

**NOTE:** You are eligible for the scholarship even though you've been to Israel in the past.
