



ONTARIO SCHOLARSHIPS 2010/2011

1. Ontario International Education Opportunity Scholarship

Eligibility:

- 1) Students must be Canadian Citizens, Permanent Residents of Canada (landed immigrants), or a Protected Person.
- 2) Students must be completing an international academic study, work study, or co-op placement period of at least 2 months in duration that takes place between April 1, 2010 and March 31, 2011.
- 3) Demonstrated financial need and a good academic standing
- 4) The following candidates will be given special consideration:
 - Aboriginal students
 - Francophone students
 - Students with Disabilities
 - Students whose academic program has a focus on biotechnology (a course of study primarily concerned with "the application of science and technology to living organisms, as well as parts, products and models thereof, to alter living or non-living materials for the production of knowledge, goods or services."
- 5) A student is not eligible to apply if they are participating in a Government of Ontario sponsored exchange program I.e. Ontario- Baden Wurttemberg.

Possible Award: \$2,500

Application Process: Fill out application form (subject to change yearly). These forms are specific to your Ontario University. Here is an example of the [Application form](#). Please search your University website for Application form. Applications must be completed and returned to specified university office, usually posted on application form.

2. Ontario Student Assistance Program – OSAP

Eligibility:

Loan is eligible for students who wish to study at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Students studying abroad are eligible for the Canada portion of the Canada-Ontario Integrated Student Loan.

Possible Award: Completely needs based

Requirements: In almost all cases, money must be paid back. Often, interest payments are waved or reduced.

3. The Meyer Gasner/Joe Berman Education Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

Open to students who are planning a year of study in Israel to further their Jewish education. Preference will be given to those students who intend to pursue a career in Jewish education.

Applicants must have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or its equivalent. Applicants must be residents of the Greater Toronto Area and demonstrate financial need.

Two letters of reference from persons other than relatives

Eligibility: Be graduates of Associated Hebrew Schools Middle School and have attended Associated for at least two years; Propose to enroll in a full year program in Israel, which is approved by the Scholarship Committee
