1. Canadian Friends of the Hebrew University

Israel Asper National Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

Open to Canadian citizens and landed immigrants of Canada.
Must be a high school graduate, aged 17 and up.
Must provide an acceptance letter to a Hebrew University program

This scholarship fund is strictly based on financial need.

Requirements:

All applicants must provide full family tax returns for the taxation year prior to application year.

Possible Award: Range from \$1,000.00 - \$10,000.00

Application Process:

Indicate on the General CFHU Scholarship form available on the CFHU website, noting that you are applying for the Israel Asper National Scholarship Fund.

*Your scholarship application to the Asper National Scholarship Fund will not be reviewed without the completion of Part 2.

The Morris M. Pulver Scholarship Fund Hushy Lipton Memorial Scholarship Fund

Eligibility:

Must have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or its equivalent

3. Canadian Zionist Federation - Dr. Leon Aryeh Kronitz Scholarship

Eligibility:

Many synagogues have funds for higher Jewish education offered to members of the congregation.

5. Hebrew University of Jerusalem

Lady Davis Fellowship Trust Fund

Eligibility:

Visiting Professorships - you must be a full or an associate professor.

Post-doctoral researchers - you must have received your Doctorate within the past four years.

Doctoral students - you must be enrolled in a recognized doctoral program at a university outside Israel.

Possible Award: Varies

Application Process:

Lady Davis Fellowships are awarded after a rigorous academic review process.

Candidates are ranked first at the Departmental level, and then at Faculty level.

Prospective candidates must establish contact with the relevant Faculty or Department at the Hebrew University, and ensure that there is a Faculty member willing to sponsor the application. We will not be able to process an application without a sponsor.

**Requirements:**

Visiting professors are typically expected to teach courses, participate in or lead seminars, engage in research with their hosts, or interact with other Faculty members. The precise mix of activities will be mutually decided upon by the Visitor and his/her academic sponsor.

Rothberg International School Graduate Merit Scholarship**Eligibility:**

To be considered, candidates must have completed their undergraduate degree and have a minimum GPA of 3.8 or equivalent. Any candidate for an M.A. program may apply and those selected will be eligible for a two-year fellowship, conditional on



maintenance of academic performance. Candidates for any other graduate program are not eligible to apply for the Graduate Merit Fellowship.

Award: The cost of full tuition for an academic year. Needs based awards available.

7. Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture

International Doctoral Scholarship for Studies Specializing in Jewish Fields

Eligibility:

Any graduate student specializing in a Jewish field that is officially enrolled or registered in a doctoral program at a recognized university.

Open to applicants who have had their dissertation approved.

Possible Award:

The amount of the scholarship varies in accordance with the cost of living in the country where the student is studying. Grants range up to \$10,000 a year. *Grants are given for one academic year.* They can be renewed, upon submission of a new application and supporting documents, up to a maximum of four years.

Application Process:

International Fellowship in Jewish Studies and Jewish Culture

Eligibility:

Any qualified scholar, researcher or artist who possesses the knowledge and experience to formulate and implement a project in a field of Jewish specialization.

Possible Award:

The amount of the grant varies in accordance with the cost of living in the country in which the fellowship recipient resides. Grants range up to \$10,000 per year. *Grants are for one academic year.* Ordinarily, no more than two grants will be made to an individual.

8. Canadian Government Student Loans

Eligibility:

Open to those planning to attend a post-secondary institution.
Must be able to demonstrate financial need.

NOTE: It is very important to apply for student loans as your eligibility for these loans may make you eligible for many other awards.

Possible Award: Varies

REMINDER: These are loans that must be repaid

Application Process: Dependent on each province.

9. MASA Scholarships

Eligibility:

Applicants must be Jewish

Applicants cannot be a new immigrant or citizen of Israel

Applicants must never have participated in a long-term program in Israel that began after 1st September 2004.

Applicants must have graduated high school and be under the age of 31 at the start of the program.

Possible Award: Dependent on program and duration
